

## ORDER OF AN EXECUTIVE OFFICER Boil Water Order

To: The Village of Barons, Alberta

**RE:** The Drinking Water Supply located in Barons, Alberta

WHEREAS I, an Executive Officer of Alberta Health Services, have inspected the above noted drinking water supply pursuant to the provisions of the Public Health Act, RSA 2000, c. P-37, as amended:

**AND WHEREAS** such inspection disclosed that the following conditions exist in and about the above noted drinking water supply which are or may become injurious or dangerous to the public health or which might hinder in any manner the prevention or suppression of disease, namely:

a. A main break and valve failure resulted in depressurization and shutoff of main drinking water to the whole village affecting up to 156 houses.

AND WHEREAS such inspection disclosed that the following breaches of the Public Health Act Nuisance and General Sanitation Regulation, Alberta Regulation 243/2003 exist in and about the above noted Drinking Water Supply, namely:

a. A main break and valve failure resulted in depressurization and shutoff of main drinking water to the whole village affecting up to 156 houses, which is in contravention of the Nuisance and General Sanitation Regulation Section 11, which states "Where a person provided a source of water that the person intends to be used or realizes or ought to realize will be used by the public for human consumption, the person shall ensure that the water is potable".

AND WHEREAS by virtue of the foregoing, the above noted Drinking Water Supply is hereby declared **unfit for human consumption**;

## NOW THEREFORE, I hereby **ORDER** and **DIRECT**:

- 1. That the Owner immediately issues a Boil Water Advisory to all users of the above noted Drinking Water Supply by the fastest and most effective means possible.
- 2. That the Owner immediately undertake and diligently pursue the completion of the following work in and about the above noted drinking water supply, namely:
  - a. Repair the potable water line leak.
  - b. Flush distribution system in accordance with the requirements of Alberta Environment and Parks.
  - c. Ensure water treatment parameters are brought back to acceptable levels as required Alberta Environment and Parks.

- d. Ensure two sets of bacteriological water samples, submitted 24 hours apart from representative locations throughout the distribution system, are submitted to the Provincial Laboratory of Public Health for analysis.
- 3. That, until such time as the work referred to in paragraph 2 is completed to the satisfaction of the undersigned, or an executive officer of Alberta Health Services, that this order shall remain in effect.

The above conditions were noted at the time of inspection and may not necessarily reflect all deficiencies. You are advised that further work may be required to ensure full compliance with the Public Health Act and regulations, or to prevent a public health nuisance.
