The next regular Council Meeting will be held on January 14, 2025 at 7:00 pm.





Canada Post on Strike



Due to the ongoing Canadian Union of Postal Workers strike, the Village of Barons is unable to mail out any utility bills or receipts.

Utility bills will have to be picked up in person from the Village Office during Office hours.

Bills can be paid in person at the Village Office during office hours by cash, cheque, debit or credit, or you can drop off a cheque to our mail slot on the door if the office is closed.

The Village also accepts e-transfers to **cao@barons.ca**; just be sure to note your full name, account number, or tax roll number in the comments section. You can also pay through your bank using online banking or in person at your branch if you bank with ATB Financial.

There will be no outgoing mail during the strike.

IMPORTANT VILLAGE NOTICES

Speed Limits

A reminder that speed limits within the Village of Barons is a maximum of 30 kms. This applies to everyone, so please be respectful.

Truck Routes

Truck routes must be adhered to at all times. If unsure as to what is the truck route, please contact the Village Office. Reminder that no Jake brakes are to be used within the Village.

Recycling

The recycling centre is located behind the old firehall at 201 Main Street. The only items that can be dropped off are paper, cardboard and tin cans. No glass or plastic is permitted.

Garbage

A friendly reminder that residents need to get their garbage bin out to the curb by 7:00 a.m. on Wednesdays to ensure pickup. The garbage bin must stand alone with no garbage obstructing the pickup from the mechanical arm. Please also ensure that the garbage bins are pointed in the right direction or they will not be picked up.

Only household garbage will be picked up. Construction materials, yard waste, hazardous waste such as flammables, paint, freon, ashes/coals from a fireplace or stove, chemicals, motor oil, roofing materials and insulation to name some are prohibited in your household garbage bin.

Wood and Outside Vegetation Disposal

At the back of the Village Office, located at 210 Main Street, is a bin that residents may dispose of their grass clippings, tree/bush trimmings, and wood. All items must be removed from bags and disposed of accordingly.

The Village Public Works monitors this site and orders a new bin when it gets full.

ATV - Off Road Vehicles

No person shall operate an off-highway vehicle, as defined in the Act, within the boundaries of the Village of Barons unless such use is expressly permitted by Council or the Chief Administrative Officer, as per the Traffic Bylaw #705.

Snow Removal

Just a reminder for everyone to ensure that all sidewalks surrounding your property is shovelled - as per the Village of Barons policy. It is the responsibility of the owner to maintain your property.
